 You were not happy with the current on-campus food options.

We sought feedback from all students and shared this with MIC in advance of the new catering tender process.

 MIC Thurles students wanted access to gym facilities.

We worked with the Vice Dean, MIC Thurles to secure a membership deal for Thurles students for the TUS Sportslab

 There are not enough study spaces on the Limerick Campus during the examination periods.

We secured empty classrooms that could be used as additional study spaces during the autumn and spring semester examinations.

→ You wanted more reasons to stay around campus between lectures.

→ You wanted to avail of pregnancy tests alongside the free contraception.

We continued to work with the MIC Estates & Sustainability Office to ensure the Park & Ride would run again this year and that there was additional security in the on campus car parks to control illegal parking and blocking of cars.

We organised a number of on-campus activities during the daytime, such as independent vendors, Teacher Recruitment Fair, Informational campus visits and music on the TARA Steps.

We continued to operate a private and confidential pregnancy test delivery service with the support of the Office of Student Life.

We Did

 It can be difficult to attend Class Rep training on set days and times.

We developed a Moodle Module specially for Class Reps that included self-guided online training.

 You wanted more recreational options in the Students' Lounge.

We also Introduced new incentives and recognition for Class Reps such as the Letter of Commendation from the MIC President.

We placed colouring pages and pencils in the Students' Lounges on both campuses. We also placed a 'Free Little Library' in the Students' Lounge on the Limerick campus.

Cost of living continues to be one of the greatest barriers you have for attending college.

We established a bookable Food Pantry on the Limerick Campus and are exploring ways to bring this service to the Thurles Campus. We continued to offer the Food Parcels Delivery Service.

To raise awareness of the welfare supports which we offer, we increased our promotion to include the MIC electronic screens, posters around campus and frequent social media posts.

We installed DRS Donations Bins across both campuses with monies raised from donations being used to support the Student Welfare Fund.

→ You wanted a more relaxed Charity Week with a focus on daytime events rather than nighttime events and wanted the bar back on campus.

→ You wanted more evening events on the Thurles Campus.

We worked with Dolans to provide the bar on Limerick campus with a number of activities and events taking place across the Week including:

- Valentine's cards crafts
- Sock-It! (design a pair of socks)
- Lucky Dip
- Raffle
